Workforce Investment and Opportunities Act (WIOA)

Program description: High school diploma or Hi-SET program, focusing on employment preparation and attainment and/or enrollment in post-secondary education

Eligibility guidelines: Age: 14-21 (in-school), 16-24 (out-of-school)
